Dear City Council Members,

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to the proposed McDonald's Drive-Through Quick Serve Restaurant at Laurel Plaza (CUP 03-20) and Design Review (DR 09-20) project located at the North of Laurel Road within the Laurel Plaza Shopping Center. The Oakley Union Elementary School District has reviewed the plans and is concerned that this project will greatly impact the district and its safety of our students.

Laurel Elementary School and O'Hara Park Middle School are in close proximity of the Laurel Plaza Shopping Center with approximately 1,109 students that attend both schools each day. Many of these students are transported to school via car or walk or bike to and from school. In addition, on a normal day, a number of busses transport students to/from the schools during hours that the restaurant would be open. Large numbers of the students will be leaving the schools at several times each day which results in very heavy pedestrian and vehicular traffic in the neighborhoods, and we are concerned that students who are part of this heavy school traffic could be placed in harm's way. I am concerned that over the past 13 months parent and student traffic have been almost non-existent due to our schools being closed. With full return to school being planned for the 2021-2022 school year, both foot traffic and vehicle traffic will increase greatly in an area that already sees a lot of traffic.

The number one priority in our District is the safety and wellbeing of all members of our school community, and we are concerned that the proposed restaurant will create potential harm to members of our school community.
